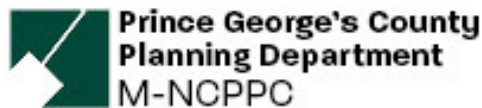

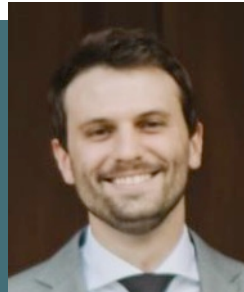

Black History Program Visual Arts Internship

Youth Arts Corp

- Professional artists and educators lead teen artists to create and install original public art throughout the County
- Created **14** murals throughout the County park system
- Murals are site-specific and feature historic images and nearby points of interest
- **Community service hours** or **hourly wages**

Teen Performance Ensemble and Prince George's Children's Theater

- Teen performers earn money while enhancing their abilities in acting, singing, and dance
- Graduates have gone on to study at some of the premier drama departments in the nation
- Become professional actors, radio personalities, playwrights, and theatrical directors
- Spring auditions for **any student 16** or older. **Actors earn an hourly wage** while providing live entertainment for their younger peers

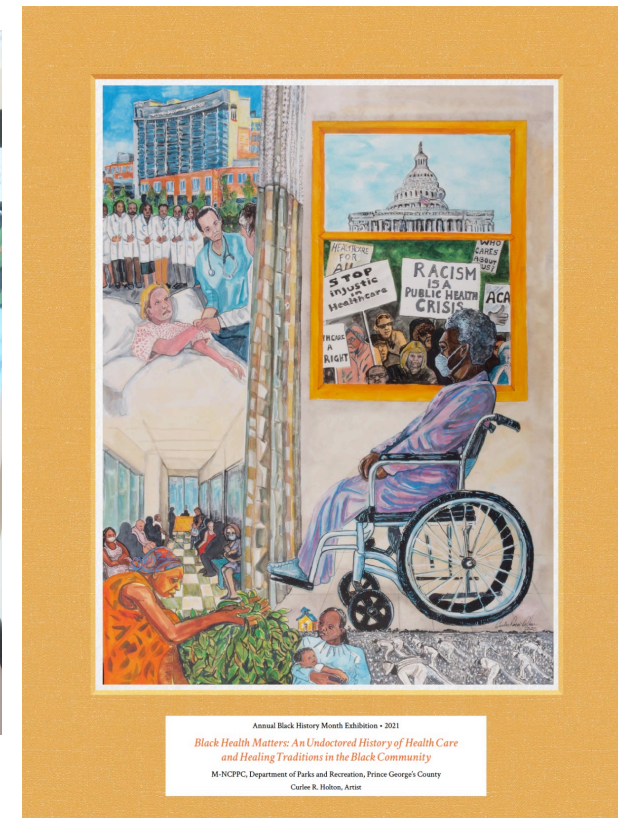


Black History Program Visual Arts Internship

- Students, led by a professional artist, design the annual Black History Month Poster for Department of Parks and Recreation
- Students selected for the internship receive a **stipend** for their summer work
- Summer internship **open to students, ages 15-19**, who attend school or live in Prince George's County

Wooden Floor Dance

Santa Ana, California



- Dance to transform the lives of young people in low-income communities
- Long-term approach grounded in exploratory dance education
- 100% of graduates enroll in higher education

Mosaic Youth Theater

Detroit, Michigan

- Mosaic is a youth development non-profit organization
- Mosaic empowers young people by helping them develop patterns of disciplined work ethics, and effective problem-solving skills through the creation of high-quality, professional-level performances of theater and music
- This program caters to youth from 7-18

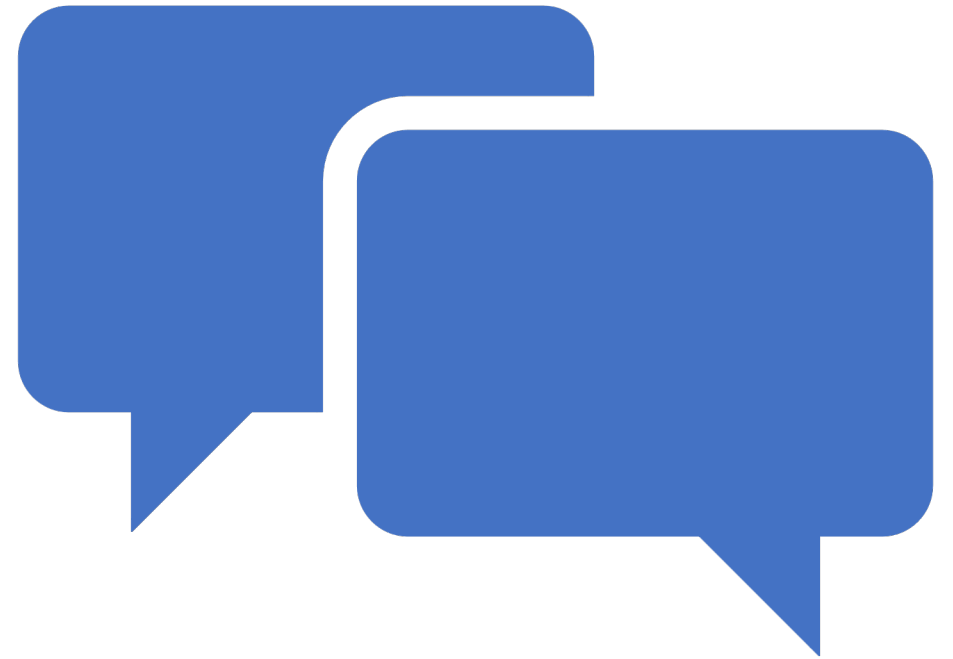

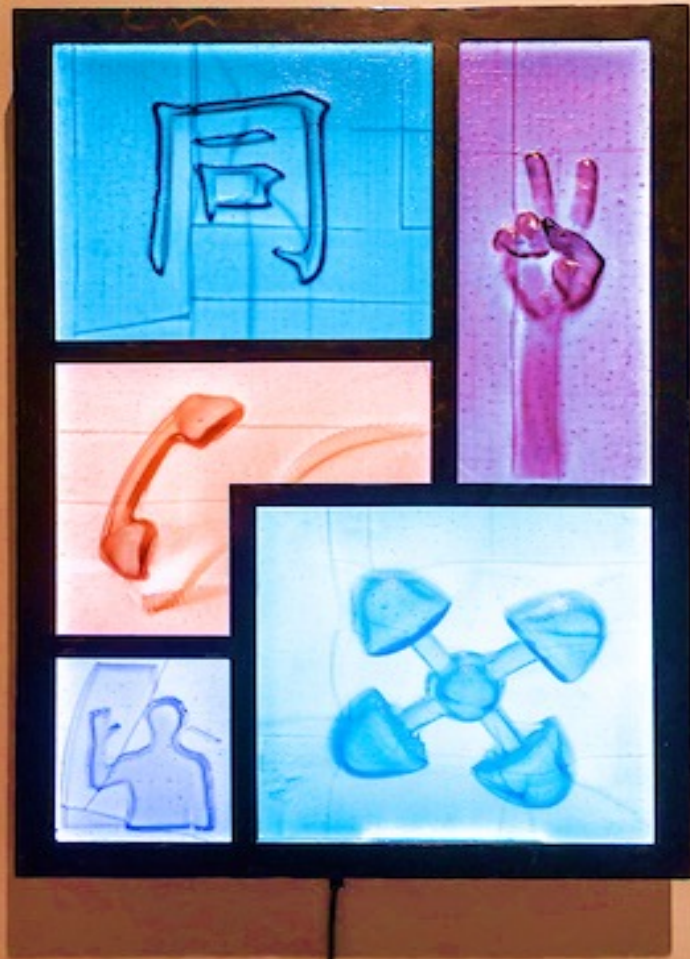
