The <u>Prince George's County Cultural Arts Study</u> recently hosted its second and third virtual Community Meetings focusing on the Impact of Arts on Economic Development, and the Role of the Arts in Creative Placemaking. The meetings highlighted how the arts contribute more than \$800B annually to the US economy, as well as where and how art can be created throughout the County. In smaller groups, participants discussed multiplier effects, job creation, audience development, and what makes up the creative economy.

Black History Month Feature: They Say I'm Your Teacher

The Literacy Project teamed up with Filmmakers Lucy Massie Phenix and Catherine Murphy

to release their short film, 'They Say I'm Your Teacher.' The film explores the birth of Citizenship Education Schools which taught adult literacy and voter registration in the 1950s. Bernice Robinson, an African American beautician from South Carolina, was the first teacher at the Citizenship School. The school helped cultivate community organizations and Black leadership training and was instrumental in setting the stage for the freedom struggle for the next decade. Catherine Murphy and the film's archival researcher Malkia K. Lyda of Kuyamba Media are both Prince George's County residents.
